

# SURGICAL OPTIONS

## 1. STANDARD VISION CORRECTION

**UPGRADE FEE: \$0**

- Single Focus Lens Implant (IOL)
- Astigmatism will not be corrected
- Vision can be targeted for distance or near, but can not guarantee final result due to normal IOL healing
- May require glasses or contact lenses to correct vision for distance, intermediate and near

## 2. ASTIGMATISM VISION CORRECTION

**UPGRADE FEE: \$1250 per eye**

- Standard Cataract Surgery with additional Astigmatism Correction
- Single Focus Lens Implant (IOL)
- Vision can be targeted for distance or near, but can not guarantee final result due to normal IOL healing
- May require glasses or contact lenses to correct vision for distance, intermediate and near
- If necessary additional LASIK / PRK laser vision correction to fine tune your vision costs \$600 per eye

## 3. MULTIFOCAL VISION CORRECTION

**UPGRADE FEE: \$3250 per eye**

- Cataract Surgery with additional astigmatism correction
- Multifocal Lens Implant (IOL) or Multifocal Astigmatism Lens Implant
- Both eyes targeted to see distance and near
- LASIK / PRK laser vision correction included if necessary to fine tune your vision

**Note:** Upgrade fees for Options 2 or 3 are in addition to the amount covered by insurance. Depending on your insurance you may have a deductible or copay fees related to the Standard Cataract Surgery.

**Note:** YAG laser capsulotomy is a procedure performed to "laser clean" the IOL if a film develops after cataract surgery. This may be necessary weeks or months after cataract surgery. This procedure is in addition to the Surgical Options above and, if needed, will be billed to insurance separately.

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## 1 Think About Your Vision Goals

Complete the "Lifestyle Questionnaire" on the next page to help determine your vision goals and discuss with your doctor what surgical option will be best for you.

## 2 Understand your Surgical Options

Review your surgical options on the back page of this pamphlet. Your doctor can help you decide if additional astigmatism correction or multifocal lens implant technology makes sense for your eyes. Not all surgical options are covered by insurance.

## 3 Complete Your Cataract Evaluation Exam

A Cataract Evaluation Exam is a complete dilated eye examination that includes additional measurements and scans necessary to customize the procedure for your eyes. Your doctor will determine if cataract surgery is indicated and whether there are any conditions that may limit your visual result after surgery. Discuss your vision goals with doctor. Please allow 2 to 3 hours for this office visit.

### Which surgical option is right for me?

Cataract surgery involves removing your cloudy lens and replacing it with an artificial intraocular lens (IOL).

Surgical options exist to improve your vision either with or without glasses. An important question to ask yourself is, "How dependent on glasses do I want to be after surgery?" While the final IOL healing position cannot be guaranteed, your doctor will select a lens that will help you achieve your vision goals.

Our goal at Moyes Eye Center is to provide an excellent cataract surgery experience regardless of which surgical option you choose.
